Information on Other Fees	<p>Includes materials workbooks, and rentals, student activities, medical and health services, insurance, technology and audiovisual materials, as well as a fee for campus improvements. In Early Childhood this fee also includes student supplies. In addition, families pay for class field trips of more than one day starting in 5th grade. These are billed on a prorated basis during the months prior to the trip.</p> <p>Technology fees, class field trips, and the campus fee are quoted in dollars and are billed in colones at the dollar sale exchange rate on the day of billing.</p> <p>*For this table an exchange rate of ¢570 colones was used.</p>		
Registration	A Registration fee for each year of enrollment is charged and is billed in April for the following year. The fee is 255.000 colones for levels up to Fifth Grade and 300.000 colones for Sixth to Eleventh Grades.		
Co-Curricular Activities and Opportunities	We offer a wide variety of co-curriculars: visual arts, music, sports, skills development, etc. Starting in PreKinder students are entitled to enroll in one co-curricular class within tuition. Opportunities are special classes with external providers and have a separate fee.		
Language Support Pull-Out Program	Students who require this program to reach the appropriate level of English or Spanish are charged 32.000 colones per week for each language in Primary. In Secondary the number of hours varies and is billed at 25.000 colones per lesson per week. Extended vacation periods are not charged, but Easter week and the October break are charged due to teacher contracts.

Curriculum	Bilingual curriculum to choose from three diplomas: International Baccalaureate, High School Degree recognized in the United States and the Ministry of Education Bachelor of Costa Rica . Graduates qualify to enter universities in Costa Rica, United States and other countries.

Advanced Placement (AP)	Advanced Placement is a program, created by the College Board in the United States, providing university-level studies and tests for high school students. American universities often give admission and funding (scholarships) to students who score above a certain number on tests. For a high school course to receive the designation of AP it must be audited by the College Board to determine if it meets the AP curriculum. Pan-American School offers four AP courses starting in 10th grade.
